A typical classroom at Sayele School devoid of desks. Children sit on the floor and use their knees as a rest to write on.

These two schools are lacking desks, storage facilities and the basic materials for the teachers to carry out their duties. There is also a lack of writing materials and text books. In Nankuyu Primary School there is a desperate need, also for a new classroom block so that year one can be taught under cover and not lose part of their education when the rainy season starts..

At Sayele School there is a need for some of the latrines to be rebuilt.

Health Shelter Needs



Village 1– Existing Health Shelter in Limbuli Parish

During my visit I was shown the terrible conditions in two villages where the visiting health visitors have to operate. One was under a tree with the obvious disadvantage in the rainy season. The other was under a flimsy shelter of sticks and thatch. In both cases a simple shelter with a concrete floor and galvanised sheeted roof is needed. The

community are willing to provide the bricks, sand, aggregate and labour needed but need help with the purchase of the roof timbers, galvanised sheets and cement.
